Research Science Institute(RSI 2016)

The Center for Excellence in Education named Junior Jennifer Xiao among the 51 top-achieving U.S. and 30 international scholars selected to attend the 33nd annual Research Science Institute this summer. Jointly sponsored with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, the six-week intensive program at MIT provided students with the opportunity to conduct original, cutting-edge, college-level research in state-of-the-art university laboratories, hospitals, and corporate research facilities. Under the mentorship of leading scientists, engineers, and researchers, many of whom are Nobel Prize winners, RSI scholars participated in one week of theoretical classroom work, followed by five weeks of research with a professor or research scientist in each student's area of interest. In the final week students demonstrated their work through written academic papers and presented oral findings to their peers and a panel of judges.
